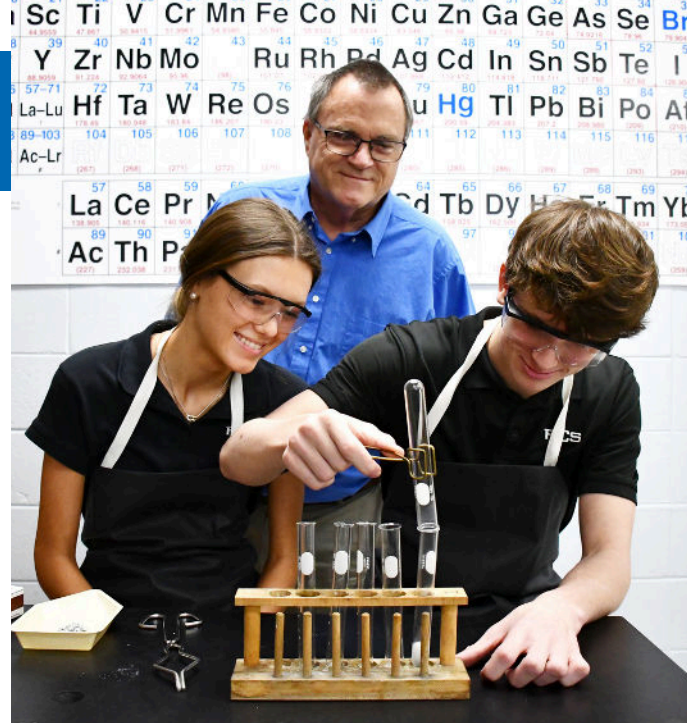

ACADEMIC SNAPSHOT

Students can earn a standard College Preparatory Diploma by completing the graduation requirements outlined below. Students who wish to pursue a more rigorous course of study may earn an Honors Diploma by completing a minimum of 10 Honors, AP, or Dual Credit courses over four years, along with five elective courses, including fine arts. PCS graduation requirements meet and exceed those established by the Mississippi Institutions of Higher Learning. With more than 40 unique high school course offerings and over 11 AP and Dual Credit courses available, PCS provides students with a wide range of opportunities to challenge themselves academically. During the 2025-2026 school year, 30 students earned AP Scholar recognition from the College Board.
